

## Carolyn's Corner

Since we are visiting Historic Spanish Point in February, I thought I would provide some color around the visit because it is a historic. environmental, and botanical site. Archeologic records exist from approximately 6000 years ago. Prehistoric people living on Tampa Bay's shoreline began using ceramics and transitioned from nomadic hunters to settled subsistence societies. They used the Sarasota Bay abundant resources to further develop permanent and seasonal settlements. They developed specialized tools but disappeared from the archeological records from the site around 1100 AD. Fast forward to the 19th century, a New Yorker named John Webb moved his family to Sarasota with a short stopover in Key West. There he met a Spanish trader who told him about an elevated site on the shores of Sarasota Bay. John named the site "Spanish Point." The family planted citrus, sugar cane, and other vegetables and built a packing house to ship the citrus north. In the early 1900's, John tried to sell parcels of land to new settlers but it was not successful. In 1910, a wealthy Chicago socialite named Bertha Palmer bought Spanish Point and thousands of acres for cattle ranching, citrus groves, and real estate development. She was a force in Sarasota history. She preserved pioneer buildings and connected them with lavish gardens and lawns. In 1959, her grandson dedicated her home as a museum. The location offers an opportunity to view different habitats and plant and tree combinations. Among the most important are the mangroves. It is also the home of many species of birds and insects including my beloved butterflies. Enjoy your visit!
